“Capturing Carbon”

PICTURE COMPETITION

The British Carbon Group invites entries into the 2008 “Capturing Carbon” Picture Competition. Entries are welcome from all organisations and individuals (of all ages) including schools, colleges, universities, and industrial organisations. There will be two categories: (i) Open Competition; and (ii) Under 18’s.

Pictures may be submitted on any aspect of carbon science including ‘at work’, photographs, electron and optical micrographs, carbon materials in action or virtual representations any facet of carbon science. All entries must be in any common electronic format, *e.g.* jpeg, tiff, bmp, *etc.* and accompanied with a title and 100 words (max) description of the picture. Entrants are asked to provide their full name, affiliation, address, email address and age (if under 18).

In submitting any competition entry, the entrants are confirming they are the copyright holder and are granting the British Carbon Group a royalty-free licence to reproduce the entry in any of the British Carbon Group publications. It is the intention to feature selected entries before and after the competition on the British Carbon Group website.

All entries (<1 Mb) must be submitted to Dr Gareth Neighbour, University of Hull, Cottingham Road, Hull, HU6 7RX, preferably by email to g.b.neighbour@hull.ac.uk). Electronic copies may also be submitted on CD-ROM. The deadline for submission will be 31st October 2008. All entries will be acknowledged by email.

The first prize in each category will be a certificate of merit awarded by the British Carbon Group and a cash prize of £150. The British Carbon Group reserves the right to award additional certificates and prizes if the judges feel special acknowledgement is deserved of individual entries. The winner will be announced shortly afterwards in the BCG Newsletter and posted on the BCG website. The winners will be invited to receive their prize at the December meeting of the British Carbon Group in London (reasonable travelling expenses, *e.g.* train fare will be paid by the British Carbon Group). Entries are limited to three per person and the decision of the judging panel is final. No correspondence will be entered into.
